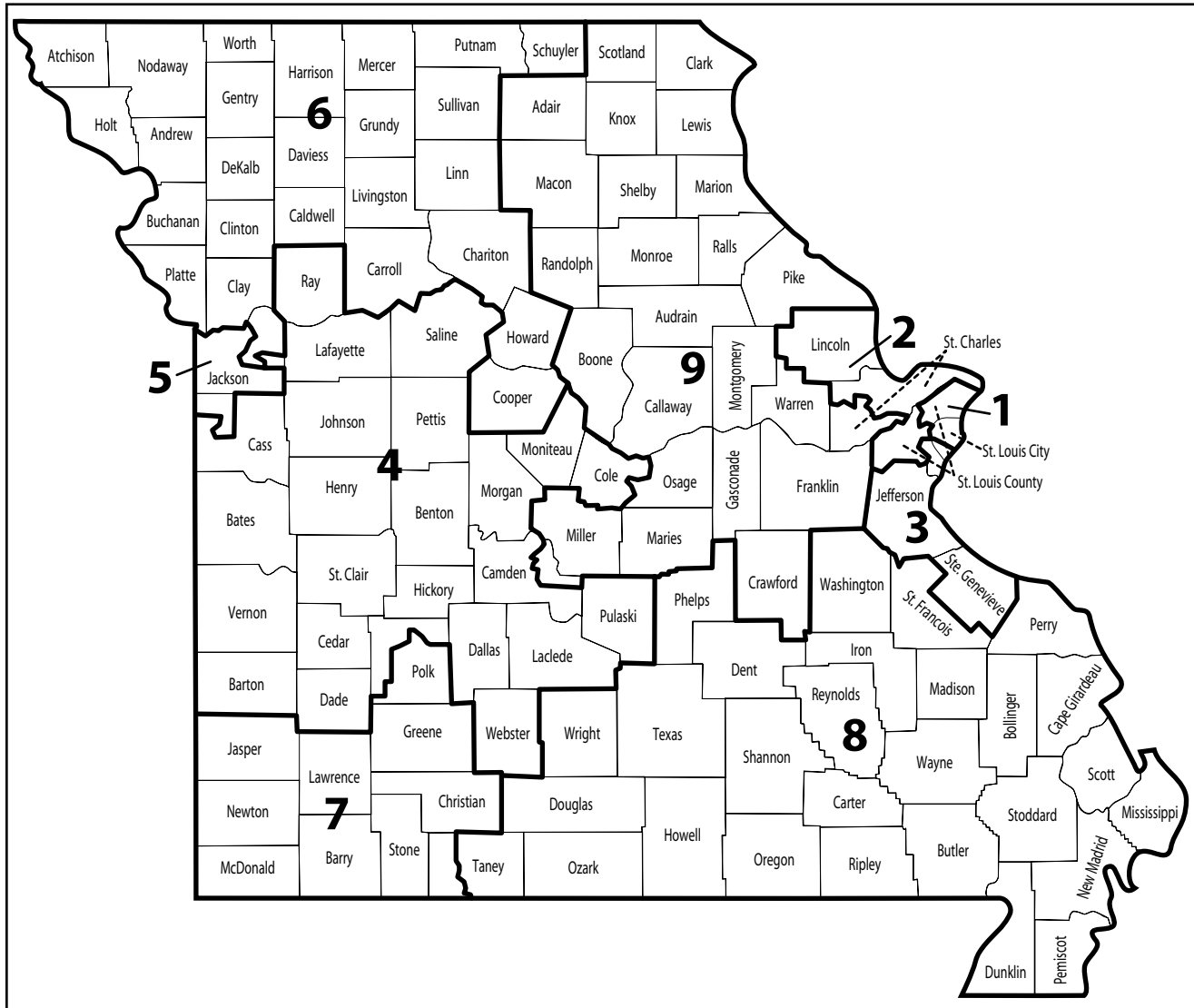


Congressional District Map—2001

This map shows the boundaries of the congressional districts as they were apportioned according to House Bill 1000, 91st General Assembly, 1st Regular Session. NOTE: Legislative and congressional districts will be reapportioned in 2011.

The number of signatures required for a statutory change is based on 5% of the total vote for Governor in 2004, and 8% of the total vote for Governor in 2004 for Constitutional changes in 6 of 9 Congressional Districts. (Mo. Const. Art. III Sec. 50)

*In St. Charles County, 77,309 votes were cast in the 2nd Congressional District and 14,554 votes were cast in the 9th Congressional District for candidate Blunt in the November 2004 election. Due to a clerical error, there is a difference between the total votes certified and these numbers.
